But then life took a turn and his new owner was unable to care for him. Soon he was kenneled, and then, after some mischief involving a cat, was tied up in his kennel with a short tie-out. He spent four long years outside in all weather with only

A bad break for his new caretaker became a great stroke of luck for Stewie. An eviction notice meant that Safe Haven received a call for help. He was relinquished on August 9th, 2022 and spent two years winning everyone's heart. He taught our volunteers to play Stewie Ball, enjoyed picking out new toys to deconstruct, and snuggling on the couch after a good walk, preferably not in the snow. Not a bad way to spend two years, but we all wanted him to have his own couch and a family to call his very own. A concerted effort was started to find that perfect home. Two years was long enough. If it weren't for



his strong prey drive and the need to be the only child, we all knew Stewie would have been adopted a long time ago.



You have seen volunteers and possibly other community members dropping off Iowa Refundable soda and alcohol cans and bottles in the 2 large outdoor containers at Safe Haven. Currently the Iowa Refundable proceeds are being used for spaying and neutering community cats. Safe Haven's own cats are generally spayed or neutered by Dr. Barb Roland on our "vet days" at the shelter but we also have a program to help fund spays or neuters and transporting to and from either Iowa Humane Alliance in Cedar Rapids or Carnsforth Veterinary Clinic near Victor.

A semi comes from the Can Shed to pick up the accumulated refundable cans and bottles that have been sorted into bags of aluminum, plastic, and glass containers. We are fortunate to have many businesses and organizations donate their cans and bottles, so they pile up quickly. By the time the Can Shed comes for a pick up, the cold storage area of Safe Haven is wall to wall bags.

At the last pick, there were 113 bags! Volunteers, led by Mary McCord, hustled the bags (and boxes of glass containers) to the loading dock and finished amazingly quickly. That load of cans and bottles netted \$1040, after deducting \$60 for a carton of 12 rolls of bags and \$15 for the services of the semi stopping to pick up the donated refundables. This is our summertime dollar amount. We can expect it to be less than that in the winter.

Thank you to all of you who bring refundables and to those who help collect, sort, and load them at Safe Haven. Thank you, too, to Williamsburg Manufacturing and Amana Golf Course who allow us to pick up their bags of unsorted soda bottles and cans for processing and sale.

If any of you know of other businesses that might want us to pick up theirs, please let me know.

Every Wednesday, I join my crew in the surgery suite to help with the week's surgeries and procedures. It is, hands down, the best day of my week. I love the people I've worked shoulder to shoulder with these past few years and call them family. I've helped out with many of the working pieces at Safe Haven. In 2006, I walked dogs and helped with cats. I've fostered 85 cats and kittens - with only 2 foster fails. I have taught kitten fostering classes. I planned the Fur Ball for the 1st ten years and helped at other fundraisers. I've taken kittens to Highland Ridge to visit the folks in the memory unit. I've created flyers and have been plugging away at this newsletter for nearly two years. All of these have filled my cup to overflowing but in the surgery suite, with my little adopted family, I feel like I have really found my sweet spot.

On any given Wednesday, you can find our team bustling around the surgery suite, prepping the operating room, getting kennels ready for patients, or preparing records for the days agenda. My first couple of weeks in the surgery suite were pretty overwhelming. There are a lot of procedures and techniques to learn. At this time, I had only fostered a couple dozen kittens, and most had been very healthy. One of my foster kittens at the time was struggling with diarrhea and dehydration. He required sub Q fluids twice a day to keep him alive while he fought a virus. I had no experience with anything requiring needles and was pretty squeamish about trying to give fluids to a kitten weighing less than a pound. Kimberly Buresh was kind enough to stop by my place to give the fluids. I soon felt guilty about taking up so much of her free time not to mention putting extra miles on her car, so I asked her to teach me to do it. A short time later, she invited me to help Dr. Barb Roland in the surgery suite. Week after week, Dr. Barb and her team, including Susan Shaull-Scheer and Kimberly, patiently shared all I would need to know to be of help in the surgery suite and answered hundreds on questions in between. I was hooked! I couldn't have asked for better teachers. Dr. Barb has an easy way of explaining how to do something and why we were doing it. She shares her wide array of knowledge like a friend sharing her favorite recipe. Her leadership has modeled a wonderful work atmosphere that rarely feels like work. Our Wednesdays are filled with laughter and friendly banter. Even with inevitable mishaps, it's a perfect

It has been fun to share this new-found knowledge with others who spend time with us on surgery days. Everyone who joins us fills a spot we didn't know was needed until they walked through the door.

In August, we were blessed to have the help of Reese Osgood, a Hawkeye football player from Wisconsin, who plans to become a veterinarian. Reese came to us with some knowledge since his father was a vet, and he was comfortable with trying procedures and watching surgeries. Hopefully, he took home some new found skills and some tales from the Safe Haven Surgery Suite.
